GLC 2024 RECAP

What a year it has been!

Straight out of the gates, we had 7 people baptised on one Sunday! We are believing to see that multiply in 2025. We had 5 baby dedications, 2 new babies born, and 1 wedding.

We have had 5518 people worship Jesus in GLC over the course of the year. 139 people have visited GLC for the first time, and 492 people have returned to visit GLC in 2024.

We estimate that 2500 cups of coffee have been drunk, 1680 lunches served, 1832 communion cups handed out, 192 songs of praise and worship sung, 240 people have come down to the front for prayer, and Ps. Andrew has preached almost 5 hours over the time limit for the year (ha!)

We held our first ever Prayer Retreat in March, hosted a Mental Health Panel in August, and had our Family Camp in October. We have built new rhythms into our church calendar, and we are excited to continue growing as a church community.

The Geraldton Campus have their final service after 5 years of ministry, and sadly, we farewelled and honoured the memories of Vio Manica and Paul Falzun.

It has been a year that has caused us to cling tightly to the cross, as we have at times endured hardship and pain, in the midst of the eternal joy that salvation through Christ brings to us.

Every smile, every tear, every disagreement, every hug, every misunderstanding, every conversation - is all to remind us that we are a church family **brothers and sisters in Christ.**

And how special it is to be able to walk through life together - not alone. As a crazy, Christ-loving, family!

Together we were able to put together over 75 shoeboxes full of gifts and toys for children all around the world!

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
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SEED OFFERING 2024

A WORD FROM PS. ANDREW...

Hello Church!

It's that time of the year again! A time to reflect on the year that has been, but also to consider all that God can do in the next 12 months.

And what a year it has been! It has been exciting and uncomfortable! We have experienced amazing highs, and grief-filled lows. We have seen new people come to Christ and join our church, and we have seen old friends move on. We have celebrated with people in their victories, and cried with people in their struggles. It has been a beautiful picture of what the church should look like. And I just want to say '**thank you!**' From the bottom of my heart, I am so grateful for you all.

Looking to 2025, I have been captivated by the faith of the woman in **Luke 8:40-48.** We often read this story and glaze over it because we may feel that miracles may happen for others - *but it doesn't happen for me*. It is a confronting reality to see the miraculous happen in the bible, but not in our own lives.

Two things I glean from this passage:

The first thing is Jesus' **willingness** to heal the woman. We often make the woman the object of this passage - but it should be Jesus. Jesus has the power in the hem of His garment. Jesus took the time to stop, after being interrupted, to address the woman. Jesus was willing to heal even when He was already on His way to somewhere else.

JESUS WAS WILLING.

The second thing is the woman's desperation. The woman crawled on the ground, through a crowd to touch the hem of Jesus' garment **what did she think was going to happen?** Desperation does that you. It removes pragmatism and rationale, and causes you to try things you would normally talk yourself out of.

THE WOMAN WAS DESPERATE.

The takeaway here is that when Jesus' willingness and our desperation collide - **miracles can happen!**



We often see desperation as synonymous with crisis, but I am not talking about crisis being the catalyst for faith - it can be! But what I'm talking about is seeking to live a lifestyle of hunger - that isn't ashamed to crawl on the ground to reach the hem of Jesus' garment, and isn't afraid to look foolish (desperate) in the eyes of others.

The more you know God, the more you will realise that no other bread brings true life, and no other water will eternally quench your thirst. The more you know God, the more you hunger to know God. The more you hunger to know God, the more your trust and faith in Him will grow.

Therefore, I desperately want to remind my soul that Jesus is the Way, the Truth, and the Life - in all things.

So, in 2025 we are believing for Jesus' willingness and our desperation and hunger to produce transformative fruit in our lives.

We are believing for altars full of desperate people, throwing ego, rationale, and pragmatism to the side, and reaching for the hem of Jesus' garment! We are believing that we will see a culture of faith stir up in GLC that overflows into our local communities, our workplaces, our families, and our world! We are believing that we will see souls come to Salvation through Jesus Christ! We are believing that sickness will cease in people's bodies and demons will flee at the name of Jesus! We are believing that this year will be a great year of fruitfulness in our church and our lives!

But we need to get desperate. Because Jesus is willing.

Trust me, I've prayed for people to get healed and they have not. It is disheartening. But I am determined to not let those moments dictate my faith going forward.

So, I am committing to desperate and hungry faith. Are you? I am committing to praying for miracles even if logic says it's a waste of time. Are you? I am committing to believing that God can heal, even if I have been disappointed by past experiences. Are you? I'm committing to prophesying life to the dry bones. Are you? I'm committing to staring down mountains and telling them to move in Jesus' name! Are you?

Here's to seeing people transformed by faith in 2025 - in Jesus' name!
